„Integrated assistance and services for asylum seekers in Romania – ASIST SA” 2018

Overall objective of the project

The overall objective of the project is to improve the situation of asylum seekers in Romania by promoting complementary material and social assistance and specialized services aiming to raise the living standard of asylum seekers in Romania.

Through this project, you may benefit from the following services:

- *Assistance, counselling and complementary facilities which consist in getting informed on the totality of the socio-economic rights and legal obligations (other than those regarding the asylum procedure);*
- *Support in getting access to public services available for at least 600 asylum seekers enlisted in the project, as regards: the labour force market, the social insurances system, access to accommodation and cultural orientation;*
- *Effective material assistance granted to asylum seekers in order to improve their living standard;*
- *Activities of orientation and adjustment to the Romanian society (Romanian language courses for children and adults, recreational and cultural activities, development of professional skills in order to adapt themselves to the characteristics of the Romanian society, rules of cohabitation in asylum seeker accommodation centres as well as in society etc.)*

Are you an asylum seeker in Romania?

You have the following social rights and obligations:

1. Rights:

- a) You may participate to cultural adjustment activities;
- b) If you do not have the necessary means to provide for yourself, you may benefit, upon request, from the necessary assistance throughout the asylum procedure;
- c) If you do not have the necessary material means for your maintenance, you may be placed in a centre for procedures and accommodation for asylum seekers;
- d) If you are a disabled person (a person with special needs) you may benefit from accommodation and assistance adapted to your situation;
- e) If you suffer from acute or chronic diseases which represent an imminent danger to your life, you are entitled to receive free-of-charge primary medical assistance and emergency assistance in hospital, as well as from free-of-charge treatment through the national system of emergency medical assistance and professional first aid;
- f) You may be included in the public health national programmes for the prevention, surveillance and control of contagious diseases;
- g) If you are a disabled person (a person with special needs), you may receive adequate medical assistance;
- h) You may receive social assistance in accordance with the legislation in force;
- i) You may obtain access to the labour force market if your asylum procedure is pending in a court of law or if 3 months have passed since you are in asylum procedure and IGI have not issued a decision in this respect, and this delay occurred for reasons that you may not be held accountable for. In such a case, you may benefit from labour force employment stimulation measures as well as from protection within the unemployment benefits scheme, under the same legal terms as for the Romanian citizens;
- j) If you are a minor, you may have access to the compulsory nursery, preschool and school educational system in the same conditions as Romanian citizens;
- k) If you are a minor, you benefit from the same protection offered, under the law, to Romanian underage persons in difficulty;
- l) In order to facilitate access to the Romanian educational system, minor asylum seekers benefit from a free-of-charge intensive Romanian language course meant to prepare them for the enrolment in the national educational system. At the end of the

course, a board assesses their level of Romanian language skills and decides consequently upon the school grade that minor asylum seekers should be enrolled in.

Access to social rights and reception material conditions:

- a. You are entitled to benefit from social assistance measures (granted upon written request filed by an asylum seeker, by the representative of the nongovernmental organization who legally represents the asylum seeker or by the latter's legal representative).
- b. You are granted, upon request, food up to RON 10.00/person/day, clothes in the amounts of RON 67/person/summer season and RON 100.00/person/winter season as well as other expenses of up to RON 6.00/person/day, representing expenses related to local transport, cultural services, press, expenses incurred in connection with repair and maintenance operations, and expenses related to one's personal hygiene.
- c. When the accommodation capacity of the centres for procedures and accommodation of asylum seekers is exceeded, the General Inspectorate for Immigration may offer asylum seekers, within the limit of their available funds, a sum of money for them to rent a place to live.
- d. **If you do not comply with the Regulations of Internal Order of IGI Regional Centres for Procedures and Accommodation or if you do not abide by your legal obligations, the General Inspectorate for Immigration may limit or withdraw the reception material conditions.**

2. Obligations:

- a) **You have the obligation to abide by the laws of the Romanian state as well as to comply with the measures decided by the Romanian authorities competent in asylum matters;**
- b) You have the obligation to submit to the territorial offices of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, in writing, a **motivated request** containing all the data indicated by the official where the request is submitted, as well as the obligation to accept that your photograph and fingerprints be taken for the record.
Foreigners who have not turned 14 yet shall not be subjected to fingerprinting;
- c) You have the obligation to provide the competent authorities with real and **complete information** regarding your person and your asylum request;
- d) You have **the obligation to submit all the documents you are in possession of** and which are relevant regarding your personal situation;
- e) You have **the obligation to hand in the document for crossing the state border**, and you will receive an asylum seeker temporary ID card (issued by IGI);

- f) You have the obligation to follow the progress of the procedure and to inform the General Inspectorate for Immigrations whenever you change your place of residence;
- g) You have the obligation to answer the requests made by Romanian officials with competence in asylum matters;
- h) You have the obligation to undergo the medical tests for which you have been scheduled as well as to accept vaccination;
- i) When requested by the competent authorities, you have the obligation to accept to be body searched and that the objects you have upon you be searched as well.
- j) You have the obligation to leave the territory of Romania within 15 days counting from the moment when the asylum procedure was completed, if you have not been granted a form of international protection, except when your asylum request was rejected as it was deemed obviously ungrounded after it had been analysed in accelerated procedure, in which case you have to leave the Romanian territory as soon as the asylum procedure was completed.

According to the **Regulations of Internal Order of Regional Centres for Procedures and Accommodation for Asylum Seekers**, in case of disciplinary misconduct, depending on how serious your violation is, you may be applied gradual sanctions which can go as far as:

Temporary suspension of the RON 6.00/person/day allowance representing expenses related to local transport, cultural services, press, maintenance and repair services and to one's personal hygiene, for a period ranging between one and three months!

Temporary eviction from the centre for 24 hours or for 7 days!

PERMANENT eviction from the centre!
